No. 211. *Cocoa*. Market, Asunción. Feb. 11. Palm 30 to 50 feet high; the nuts are harvested for vegetable oil.

No. 227. Between Caacupé and Piribebuy, La Cordillera. Feb. 14.

162878 to 162880. *ANDROPOGON* spp. Poaceae.162878 and 162879. *ANDROPOGON LATERALIS* Nees.

162878. No. 218. Between Caacupé and Paraguari. Feb. 14. Plants 6 to 7 feet high, cespitose; herbage coarse and unpalatable when old.

162879. No. 269. Between Villarrica and Mbocayaty. Feb. 25. Tall bunchgrass.

162880. *ANDROPOGON* sp.

No. 239. Open prairie near Fonciera. Feb. 19. Bunchgrass, up to 4 feet high.

162881 to 162883. *ARACHIS* spp. Fabaceae.162881. *ARACHIS GLABRATA* Benth.**Peanut.**

No. 245. Open prairie, Fonciera. Feb. 19. Taproots up to 1 inch thick.

162882 and 162883. *ARACHIS HYPOGAEA* L.**Common peanut.**

162882. No. 207. Cultivated, vicinity of Asunción. Feb. 10.

162883. No. 208. Cultivated by T. Rojas, near Asunción. Feb. 11. A type cultivated at the Mennonite Colony Philadelphia in the Northern Chaco where it is one of major crops.

162884. *AXONOPUS AFFINIS* Chase. Poaceae.

No. 213. Roadside between Caacupé and Paraguari. Feb. 14. Plants prostrate, stoloniferous, forming dense sod.

162885. *CALEA UNIFLORA* Less. Asteraceae.

No. 263. Between Villarrica and Mbocayaty. Feb. 25. Ornamental herb with a basal rosette and white daisylike flowers.
