232228. No. 95. Evergreen Forest Camp, 4 miles south of Tamarack, Idaho County, Idaho. Plant pubescent, 5 feet high; leaves 0.75 inch wide.
232229. No. 114. Aspen grove park, Lamoille Canyon, Elko County, Nevada. Plants to 1 foot high; early maturing; five types apparent in area.
232230. No. 127. Trappist Monastery, Wasatch Range, near Huntsville, Utah, Route 39, Weber County, Utah. Single plant, 3 feet high; hairy at base of stem; leaves pilose, 0.75 inch wide at base; heavy seeder.
232231. No. 130. Trappist Monastery, Wasatch Range, near Huntsville, Route 39, Weber County, Utah. Plants to 1.5 feet high; spikes usually in leaf sheath.
232232. No. 170. Aspen grove 10 miles west of Trappers Lake, Route 132, White River Valley, Rio Blanco County, Colorado. Panicles drooping, glabrous.
232233. No. 196. Mesa Lake (Grand Mesa), Mesa County, Colorado. Elevation 10,000 feet. Plant 1.5 feet high; panicles erect, atypical.
232234. No. 291. Sandy embankment on roadside 24 miles northwest of Dubois, Route 187, Fremont County, Wyoming. Elevation 8,000 feet. Plant atypical.
232235. No. 292. Sand embankment along roadside 24 miles northwest of Dubois, Route 187, Fremont County, Wyoming. Elevation 8,500 feet. Plant atypical.
232236. No. 305. Exposed slope 7 miles north of Warm River, Route 191, Fremont County, Idaho.
232237. No. 318. Stemple Pass (Helena National Forest), Lewis and Clark County, Montana. Elevation 6,370 feet. Panicles erect.
232238. No. 319. Stemple Pass (Helena National Forest), Lewis and Clark County, Montana. Elevation 6,370 feet.
232239. No. 327. Bear Gulch, Armstrong Ranch near Lincoln, Lewis and Clark County, Montana. Elevation 4,900 feet. Plants to 5 feet high; spikelets divergent.
232240. No. 504. Grassy ravine in lodgepole pine woods, Yellowstone National Park, Bay Bridge, Wyoming. Elevation 6,700 feet. Plants to 2 feet high.
- 232241 and 232242. BROMUS PUMPELLIANUS Scribn. Bromegrass.**
232241. No. 352. Open aspen woods, 1 mile south of junction 89 and 49, Glacier County, Montana. Plant 2 feet high; spikelets tinged purple; hair on the first nerve.
232242. No. 353. Exposed soil, border of aspen woods, 1 mile south of Junction 89 and 49, Glacier County, Montana.
- 232243 to 232246. BROMUS VULGARIS (Hook.) Shear Columbia bromegrass.**
232243. No. 310. West slope, Battle Ridge Campground, 20 miles northeast of Bozeman, Gallatin County, Montana. Elevation 6,000 feet. Plant 3 feet high; florets small; caryopsis large.
232244. No. 393. Scattered in thicket along Reynolds Creek, Glacier National Park, Glacier County, Montana. Elevation 4,900 feet. Plant 2 feet high.
232245. No. 394. Scattered through fir and spruce woods, Piegan Pass Trail, 0.5 mile above Gunsight Lake, Glacier National Park, Glacier County, Montana. Elevation 4,900 feet. Plant 3 feet high; spikelets fine.
232246. No. 401. Piegan Pass Trail along St. Mary River, Glacier National Park, Glacier County, Montana. Elevation 4,900 feet. Plant 2 feet high; spikelets drooping.
