- 232267.** No. 138. Wheeler Springs, near Snow Basin, Ogden Mountain, Weber County, Utah. Plant 5 feet high, damp soil type.
- 232268.** No. 168. Ten miles west of Trappers Lake, Route 132 (White River Valley), Rio Blanco County, Colorado. Plant 3.5 feet high; awns long; leaves 1 inch wide, well up on stem.
- 232269.** No. 171. Open aspen grove 10 miles west of Trappers Lake, Route 132 (White River Valley), Rio Blanco County, Colorado. Elevation 7,500 feet. Plant to 4 feet high; spikes narrow; awns short.
- 232270.** No. 179. Twenty miles south of Buford, New Castle Road, Garfield County, Colorado. Elevation 8,500 feet. Plant 2 feet high; spikes purple.
- 232271.** No. 193. Aspen grove 5 miles north of Mesa Lake, Route 65 (Grand Mesa), Mesa County, Colorado. Elevation 8,500 feet. Plant 4 feet high; spikes 4 inches long; leaves 1 inch wide, well up on stem.
- 232272.** No. 245. Willow thicket along north shore, Half Moon Lake, (Wind River Mountains), Sublette County, Wyoming. Elevation 8,000 feet. Plant with narrow spikes.
- 232273.** No. 246. Willow thicket along north shore, Half Moon Lake (Wind River Mountains), Sublette County, Wyoming. Plant with broad spikes; typical.
- 232274.** No. 304. Gravelly siding along highway, 2 miles north of Warm River, Route 191, Fremont County, Idaho. Typical.
- 232275.** No. 328. Bear Gulch, Armstrong Ranch near Lincoln, Lewis and Clark County, Montana. Scattered, typical.
- 232276.** No. 397. Glacier National Park, Piegan Pass Trail along Reynolds Creek, Glacier County, Montana. Plants to 5 feet high, abundant; spikelets 4 inches long.
- 232277.** No. 409. Just south of Canadian border, Glacier National Park, Belly River, Glacier County. Plants to 6 feet high.
- 232278.** No. 413. Glacier National Park, Belly River, Glacier County, Montana. Elevation 4,800 feet. Heads robust.
- 232279.** No. 445. Sedge meadows, trail to Rogers Lake, Glacier National Park, Camas Valley, Flathead County, Montana. Plants to 5 feet high; abundant.
- 232280.** No. 508. Dry west slope of Mount Washburne, 0.5 mile north of Dunraven Pass, Yellowstone National Park, Wyoming. Elevation 8,700 feet.
- 232281.** *ELYMUS GLAUCUS* var. *JEPSONI* Davy **Wildrye.**  
No. 19. Deer Park School, Fairfax, Marin County, California.  
Plant 5 feet high; heavy seeder.
- 232282.** *ELYMUS INNOVATUS* Beal **Wildrye.**  
No. 421. Moist open river bank, 3 miles south of Canadian border, Glacier National Park, Belly River, Glacier County, Montana. Plant very pubescent, 2.5 feet high; spikes thick.
- 232283.** *ELYMUS PACIFICUS* Gould **Wildrye.**  
No. 18. Growing through blacktop, road to Point Reyes, front of the American Telephone Trans-Pacific sending station, Marin County, California. Plant 4 inches high; leaves longer than flowering spikes.
- 232284 and 232285.** *ELYMUS TRITICOIDES* Buckl. **Creeping wildrye.**  
**232284.** No. 26. Sierra Valley Grange, Vinton, Plumas County, California.  
Plants to 2.5 feet high, abundant; heavy seeder.
