246645. *SOLANUM PSEUDOCAPSICUM* L. Solanaceae. **Jerusalem-cherry.**
Col. No. 18269. Plant normally to three feet high, but as a house plant it can be trimmed to about 15 inches; foliage dark green; fruits deep pink.
246646. *SOPHRONITIS GRANDIFLORA* Lindl. Orchidaceae. **Orchid.**
Col. No. 18251. Plant small; flowers reddish.

Col. No. 18248. Plant grayish, growing among rocks in garden.
246648. *TELFAIRIA PEDATA* (J. E. Sm.) Hook. Cucurbitaceae.
