

304397. LYCOPERSICON PIMPINELLIFOLIUM (Jusl.) Mill. Solanaceae. Currant tomato.

From the United States. Seeds held at the Regional Plant Introduction Station, Geneva, N.Y. Numbered Feb. 26, 1965.

Component of P.I. 114611. Plant prostrate, 63.5 cm. high by 228.6 cm. wide. Fruit 14 mm. globe, red, two locules, watery, 8-15 per cluster in racemes.
