309680. BETULA JACQUEMONTII Space Betulaceae. **Jacquemont birch.**

No. 64-16 G13164. Originally from University of Washington, Seattle. Tree tall, vigorous. Bark scaly, lenticels conspicuous; leaves 12.8 by 10.0 cm., serrate. Winter hardy; resistant to birch miner. Presented by Longwood Gardens, Kennett Square, Pa.

309681. COTONEASTER OBSCURA Rehd. & Wils. Rosaceae.

No. 64-21 G13169. Originally from Villa Taranto Gardens, Pallanza, Italy. Plant uniform, low growing, vigorous; branches form 80° angle with main stem; leaves many, small dark green; flowers 1.5 cm., white, mid-August; fruit 0.6 cm., red, mid-September. Presented by Longwood Gardens, Kennett Square, Pa.

309682. CYTISUS NIGRICANS L. Leguminosae. **Spike broom.**

No. 64-24 G8551. Originally from Europe. Plant semi erect, vigorous. Leaves small; flowers 0.4 cm., yellow, late July; pod 0.5 cm. in raceme 0.5 by 4.0 cm., mid-August. Attractive, winter-hardy plant.

309683. PRINSEPIA UNIFLORA var. **SERRATA** Rehd. Rosaceae.

No. 64-30 G13150. Northwest China through Highland Park, Rochester, N. Y. Plant low growing, vigorous, much branched. Leaves many, small, elongate, smooth, dark, glossy.

309684. PRUNUS TOMENTOSA Thunb. Rosaceae. **Manchu cherry.**

No. 64-32 G13280. Claude Heit, Department of Seed Investigations, Geneva through F. W. Shumaker, Sandwich, Mass. Erect shrub, uniform, vigorous, to 3 meters, bark red brown, exfoliating. Leaves medium size, dark, rugose; flowers 1.5 to 2 cm., white, spring. Very winter hardy.

309685. ROSA WAITZIANA Tratt. Rosaceae.

No. 64-37 G13215. 'Duesterlohe'. Stern's Nursery, Geneva, New York. Plant semi-erect, vigorous. Branches many, green; thorns many, large recurved; leaves many, medium size, dark, rugose. Flowers 5.0 cm., deep pink, mid-June; fruit 1.4 cm., pale orange, late September.

309686. SALVIA GREGGII A. Gray Labiatae.

No. 65-31 G14144. Chance white flowered seedling. Plant uniform, 40.6 by 76.2 cm., much branched. Stems woody, leaves elongate, glossy, mint fragrance. Flowers many, 1.5 by 0.4 cm., white, early August. Seed mature mid-September. Presented by Longwood Gardens, Kennett Square, Pa.

Col. No. 21169. 'Ciruela'. Market in Zitacuaro, Michoacan. Fruit oblong, red. Eaten raw and cooked.

309688 to 309693. LYCOPERSICON ESCULENTUM Mill. Solanaceae. **Tomato.**

309688. Col. No. 21039. 'Jitomate'. Market in Toluca, Mexico. Elevation 2,400 meters. Fruit slender pyriform.

Market in Tepic, Nayarit. Elevation 1,050 meters. Locally grown.

309689. Col. No. 21162. Fruit pyriform, prominent neck; 5-7 cm. long.
