



THE IMODON ASH OF TURKESTAN (*FRAXINUS POTAMOPHILA*, S. P. I. No. 44132).

During his expedition to Chinese Turkestan, Mr. Meyer took the photograph reproduced above at Khanaka and obtained some of the seeds shown hanging on the tree. This species of ash, under the trying conditions of great drought, intense heat, and soil alkali of that region, made a valuable shade tree. Under S. P. I. No. 30652; the trees grown from these seeds were distributed in 1912. In 1915, some young trees were growing at the Fallon Field Station in Nevada. These promised so much for that treeless region that, through the kindness of the British vice consul, Mr. George MacCartney, more seeds (S. P. I.
